Applicants must: be permanent residents of Hong Kong; have received at least 7 years of continuous education in Hong Kong; fulfill all application procedures and admission requirements at the institution of their choices and be offered places subsequently; hold good Honors degrees obtained in Hong Kong or equivalent qualifications OR expect to obtain such degrees or equivalent qualifications; and be proficient in English and Chinese, and have a good command of the language in which their studies will be undertaken.

The Joint Japan/World Bank Graduate Scholarship Program

Executive Directors, their alternates, staff of the World Bank Group (the World Bank, International Finance Corporation, International Development Association, Multilateral Investment Guarantee Agency, and International Center for Settlement of Investment Disputes), consultants, and relatives of the aforementioned are excluded from consideration.

Description: The College Women's Association of Japan (CWAJ) is an international group of women dedicated to encouraging educational and cultural exchange between Japanese-speaking people and English-speaking people of all nationalities. Individuals currently studying or living abroad are ineligible. All CWAJ scholarship applicants are required to be living in Japan at the time of their application. Applicants must have graduated with a degree from a Japanese university (4 year course) by the end of March of the application year. Applicants must submit a TOEFL score of at least 570 (CBT 230, IBT 88) if applying for a graduate degree in the natural sciences, math, medicine or engineering, and 600 (CBT 250, IBT 100) if applying for a degree in any other field. The TOEFL must have been taken after March 31, 2006.
